Re: Sticker shock campaign-

Libby and Kipp reported on the progress the youth coalition has made with the stickers to raise awareness about social hosting and more and to be placed at participating local businesses on merchandise. Six (6) designs were created with different messages and colors. The stickers displayed bold colors with direct messages to parents reminding them they have influence over their children so talk-monitor-secure the alcohol in the home and have conversations around drinking. There were messages reminding parents of the ordinance on social hosting/supplying alcohol that costs the parents a hefty dollar fine and the QR code referencing the ordinance was shown on the sticker too. Discussion centered around the colors and the messages. The colors orange and blue were avoided as it is the school colors and wouldn't draw the attention wanted to a new message. As to the messages on the sticker, the word "supplying" alcohol in reference to the parents was discussed. It will be reviewed, and a different word may be chosen. Another question related to the stickers message and discussed was whether the kids are taking the alcohol from the home without their parent's knowledge or was it social hosting by the parents. Kim stated the evidence is ... It is both. The stickers are direct and focused on "getting the facts about your risks" message to the students and the parents too. Kim reported that the sticker shock subcommittee could use a couple more members to meet for a couple one (1) hour meetings now that the groundwork has been laid.

Re: The Wydown coalition poster contest that showcases harmful effects of using alcohol, vaping, or marijuana and give drug facts-

Kim will send an email asking coalition members to be judges at the Drug Facts Art contest or provide small donations to support the winners of this initiative. Winners will get posters hung around school and \$25-\$50 gift card of their choice.

Jenny indicated that the police dept will have a coffee/pastry event for the public and their police officers. It will be held on March 12th at Center of Clayton from 9:00-11:00am


Work Group Share:
