III. **New Business & Social Media Update: 4:06-4:10**

- A. Ali gave an overview of the website. Sticker shock campaign is happening in partnership with Clayton PD. We still have plenty of Detera bags available to distribute.

IV. **Guest Presenter: Amanda Ruback from Missouri Poison Control 4:10-4:30**

- A. Spoke about children 5 and under and THC exposure during the presentation. She will pull information for elementary/middle school aged children regarding accidental ingestion. Highest number of ingestion rates are among 2-3 year olds. Packaging, flavors and appearance of products make it appealing to this age group.

V. **Cannabis Legislation Update: Heather Craig 4:30-4:40**

-PreventEd has their legislative priorities listed on their website for community members to view. This organization supports policies that reduce the risks and effects of substance use disorders.

- "Legal MO 22" cannabis legalization and automatic expungement initiative is aiming to legalize recreational use, prohibit tax on medical cannabis, expunge records and release individuals that have been convicted of nonviolent crimes. This also would allow the state to limit business licenses.

-Cannabis Freedom Act is being sponsored by Representative Hicks. Wants to legalize recreational use for 21 and up and make it legal to have up to 12 flowering plants in one's home. This act also adds taxes of 12% on dispensary sales and does not put a cap on business licenses.

Prevent Ed will provide more information on the initiatives and what will be on the ballot for Nov. 8th. A reminder was given that we can advocate but not lobby. Beth also reminded the coalition members that we want to be mindful and respectful of every person's thoughts and beliefs.

 - 1. Board of Alderman meeting was held last week and the amendments to the social hosting ordinance were approved. The new ordinance will be live in a few weeks and the QR code on the stickers will take consumers directly to the document.
