IV. Youth Spotlight: Sophia Lu & Nick Sheppard: Hear Us Conference 4:10-4:15 *Nick and Sophia spoke to MO legislators Sen. Brian Williams and Rep. Ian Mackey regarding vaping and pushing to promote house bills for them to sign. They met weekly w/ Prevent Ed and trained on how to advocate. They created testimonials from CHS students around vaping to make it personal. Reception: they presented and talked to them about what the future could look like.*

Kim discussed the last two Caring for Head and Heart presentations; one on youth substance use which had 18 attendees and the cell phone usage panel discussion had 45 participants. Pam asked about Screenagers: we showed Angst, Screenagers, and Liked. Pam mentioned that there is a new addition of Sreenagers and the coalition discussed the possibility of having an in person viewing next school year.
