Meeting started at 4:02 PM

Approval of February Meeting Minutes: Sheryl made a motion to approve the minutes and Al seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Educational Presentation on Gambling Addiction:

Jeremiah Weinstock presented on gambling addiction:

- Highlighted his 25+ years of experience working with people struggling with gambling disorder
- Discussed the upcoming legalization of sports gambling apps in the community and the possible repercussions
- Chellie McLellan noted plans to invite Jeremiah Weinstock back for a parent event in the fall, coinciding with the expected launch of sports gambling apps

Alcohol Compliance Checks:

Al Thuet reported on recent alcohol compliance checks:

- Process: Minor attempts to purchase alcohol without ID at various establishments
- Recent check on February 7th: 11 stores visited, 3 establishments (2 retail, 1 bar/restaurant) sold to the minor
- Consequences: Summons issued to sellers, court appearance required
- Goal: Zero sales to minors
- Frequency: Planning 2-3 checks this year, down from 5 in 2023
- Program started in 2022 in partnership with All-in Coalition

High School Coalition Activities:

Sritha Rathikindi reported on high school coalition activities:

Annual youth town hall planned:

- Online event gathering youth from the prevention community. Adults from prevention community invited to listen to youth experiences
- Environmental scan planned for the next month. Youth to assess what stores are selling and advertising in Clayton
- Lock It Up Campaign. Distributing lockable bags to parents for securing prescription drugs, alcohol, or cannabis
- Wellness week planned for finals week in partnership with the wellness center
